Delivery Boy Missing

Two weeks ago, Eddie Scott, worker for a local restaurant specializing in exotic cuisine, failed to report back after making his rounds. Owners of "Slavic Galaxy" John and Francine Gallopagos claim they have no way of determining which households Scott was visiting due to an unexplained loss of their records for that night. "I wouldn't be surprised if he took the money from the deliveries and blew it on junk and rock-n-roll porn," said co-worker Lenny Valencia. "That guy was nothing but trouble." Denton Police Chief Bernard Shanks admitted that Scott has a lengthy criminal record, including assault charges, public nuisance complaints, indecent exposure, driving under the influence of propellants, and vandalism." His latest infraction, according to the neighbors



in his midtown apartment complex, was in violation of the noise ordinance and he was charged with reckless endangerment. Scott's only living relative, Dr. Everett Scott, retired science teacher at Denton High School, fears the worst. "We knew he was a no-good kid," he said, "but I have a feeling he's been drawn into something worse than usual."
